
I enjoy spending time with my family and friends. I love to spend time outdoors visiting parks and playgrounds with my son. I also love to cook and bake every day!

Arrival



8:00 AM arrival for Pre-Kindergarten (Please note that PreK will have half days on Monday, September 13th and Tuesday, September 14th from 9:00 a.m.- 11:00 a.m.)

Upon arrival students report to Exit 10 (by the staircase) where they will be picked up by their teachers.

- 1. Take students' temperature and document
- 2. Ensure masks are placed correctly. Masks will be distributed for students that do not have one. Masks must be worn.
- 3. Sanitization stations will be in place throughout the building
- Parents drop off students by their teachers by exit 10. Student names will be checked off on rosters. Please be sure to follow proper social distancing protocols, maintaining 6 feet of distance from others. Please be advised that parents are NOT allowed in the building at this time.
- Early pickup- sign in at front, student will be walked out of their classroom by a staff member by the mini building.
- Check the weather! Prepare for bringing appropriate clothing and an umbrella



Dismissal

- ✓ For Pre-K, dismissal is at 2:20 in the school yard. Please make sure you are on time and that you have made arrangements for your child in advance.
 - Please note that teachers keep a list people who can pick up students. If a person comes to pick up a child that is NOT on that list, the teacher will NOT release the child to that person. If someone else is going to pick up your child, you MUST provide a note the day before or in the morning stating the child's name, date, and the name and phone number of the person picking up your child that day. That person must provide the teacher with a picture i.d.
- ✓ If the child is not picked up by 2:25, the teacher will escort the student to the late room. If your child is not in the yard, you must walk around to the front of the building. You must present the security guard with a picture I.D.
- ✓ The late room is located in the Small Cafeteria. You must sign the book before taking your child. Your child will be escorted out to you. Please be advised that if your child is picked up late excessively, a meeting/phone call will be requested with administration.
 - Please note that there are no pets or recreational transportation such as bicycles, motorized toy scooters or quads allowed in the yard during arrivals or during dismissal. If your child arrives to school using one of those recreational transportation items, please leave them by the gate entrance. Of course, handicapped mobility support such as wheelchairs, scooters, are always allowed.

PROMOTING BEHAVIORS THAT REDUCE SPREAD



Physical Distancing

All individuals in school buildings should remain at least 3 feet apart. We will work with schools to create conditions that make physical distancing possible.



Mask are Mandatory

Face coverings will be required inside school buildings.

Each classroom is

equipped with two air purifiers Windows are open in all hallways and classrooms as well.



Keep Hands Clean

There will be increased access and regular opportunities for students and staff to wash hands or use hand sanitizer throughout the building.



Health screening forms must be completed upon arrival.

Temperature checks will also be taken prior to entering the building.

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MAINTAINING HEALTHY ENVIRONMENTS

Cleaning and Disinfection:

 Schools will need to implement enhanced cleaning and disinfection of surfaces to ensure the health and safety of staff and students.

Food Services:

Grab-and-go meals will be available for breakfast and lunch each day, though students will
also be permitted to bring their own lunch if preferred. Doing so will allow for more flexibility so
students and physical distancing can be maintained during lunch time, a time when many
students usually gather in one location. Grab-and-go meals will be delivered to students in 3K
to K classrooms. Lunch will be in classrooms to minimize interaction between groups of
students.

Safety continued...

- ✓ We kindly ask that you make (remote) appointments to speak with teachers and refrain from talking to them in the yard at dismissal or at arrival as they are walking to their classrooms from the auditorium. This poses a safety hazard to all students in the class. Teachers must keep their eyes on students and focus on getting them safely to their families or their classrooms.
- ✓ Please be advised that meetings will be conducted remotely until further notice. Parents and family members cannot enter the building past security. All meetings will be remote in order to continue to maintain proper social distancing in the school building.
- ✓ Every year, we encounter some students who are upset the first few days/weeks of school. At PS 89, we help to comfort those students and ask that parents allow them time to adjust to their new routine. Again, parents are not allowed to come into the building and sit with their child in the classroom.



Supplies



- ✓ We are asking that each parent sends their child in with their <u>own</u> individual supplies because students will not be sharing materials:

 - Individual Pencil Case for your child's supplies
 - 1 ream of white computer paper

- 1 change of clothes(weather appropriate)




